This has involved work with guidelines development, pathways of care and the structure of the future provision of rheumatology services for Oldham patients, delivering care almost entirely within a community setting.

He is Training Programme Director for General Internal Medicine for Health Education North West England and an advanced life support instructor and a course medical director.

He is a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and MRCP PACES clinical Examiner.

Dr Devakumar is external clinical advisor for the Care Quality Commission and specialist advisor for the Parliamentary Health Services Ombudsman.

He is a patron for the North West Polymyalgia Support Group, a regional specialty advisor for the Royal College of Physicians and member of the North West Rheumatology Peer Review Steering committee.
