After three years in internal medicine he entered clinical biochemistry in Glasgow and took up his current post in 1994. He completed his MD on the clinical utility of proinsulin measurement and maintains an active interest in lipids and diabetes.

His main research interest is best practice in laboratory medicine and he has led a secondary research project to produce guidance on the use of laboratory tests in primary care.

He is former Director of the Association of Clinical Biochemists Clinical Practice Section and Vice-President Council of the Association of Clinical Pathologists.

He is a former member of the NIHR Health Technology Assessment diagnostics panel and was a member of the NICE Adult Type 1 Diabetes guideline development group.

When not being a biochemist, his time is spent herding three active young daughters with his wife Gillian, and salmon fishing.
