## Meet the Speakers...

### **Prof. Dave Singh** BA (Hons) MB, B.Chir. MA (Hon) MRCP MD

**Head of the airway pharmacology group, using human lung tissue models to study inflammation in asthma and COPD**

**Medical Director for early phase clinical trials in the Medicines Evaluation Unit (MEU)**

After graduating in Medicine from Cambridge University, Prof Singh trained in respiratory medicine and clinical pharmacology. This included an industrial placement for phase 1 experience. He completed an MD at the University of Manchester, and then was appointed as senior lecturer in respiratory pharmacology based in the University Hospital of South Manchester in 2003. Prof Singh's research interests are the pharmacotherapy of Asthma and COPD with studies spanning from basic pharmacology investigations of anti-inflammatory drug action to clinical trials. He is medical director of the Medicines Evaluation Unit performing proof of concept studies in obstructive lung diseases.

#### The Burden of COPD

##### British Lung Foundation – Battle for Breath 2016

- ▶ 1.2 million people in the UK are living with COPD
- ▶ 4.5% of people aged over 40 have COPD
- ▶ 115,000 people are diagnosed with COPD each year – one every 5 minutes
- ▶ 1.7% of hospital admissions are due to COPD 144,000 per year and greater than 1 million bed days
- ▶ Prevalence 2.5 times higher in most socially deprived quintiles
