Meet the Speaker ...

Dr Steve Holmes MMedSci.MBChB.FRCGP

Steve has worked as a general practitioner since 1989 and continues to work clinically two days (5 sessions) per week. He has been a partner in Shepton Mallet since 2002, having worked previously in a rural practice on the Lancashire / Yorkshire border.



Steve is the current education lead of the Primary Care Respiratory Society (and previous chair) and co-leads the Primary Care Respiratory Academy. He is also on the education committee of the International Primary Care Respiratory Group (IPCRG). He worked for 9 years on the British Asthma Guidelines (BTS/SIGN) and was a member of the BTS Specialist Advisory Group on Asthma (2011 - 2017).

He has been involved nationally on many groups including the NHS Long Term Plan Cardiovascular and Respiratory Programme Board, the Lung Health Taskforce and the UK Lung Cancer Coalition. He has been involved in the BTS Mesothelioma and Air Travel guideline group.

Steve has been involved as a GP trainer since 1991 and has been a GP and CCG tutor and Course Organiser - and is currently an Associate Postgraduate Dean (since 2008) in Somerset leading Health Education England activities in GP Specialist Training and Primary Care development.

He remains a GP appraiser - has been involved as a senior appraiser for NHS England until 2016 - and being involved in the original development of GP appraisal. Steve has been involved in his local faculty since the mid-1990s and has been a member of RCGP College Council since 2008.

He has been involved in a wide range of respiratory educational initiatives for generalists and specialists, both medical and nursing and has undertaken work with more than eight universities.

He taught nationally on quality improvement methods for the Improvement Foundation for 6 years. He has also been involved in communication skills training for more than 20 years.

He has published more than 200 peer reviewed articles, is a reviewer for more than 10 active peer reviewed journals and amongst other things has been involved in the NIHR (UK), advising the Canadian government on respiratory research funding, teaching in Bangladesh, and lecturing in many parts of Europe/USA.

Throughout this he remains a clinician; passionate about the values of good primary care, continually developing the quality of clinical care, and providing holistic care for patients and their families from cradle to grave. He continues to believe that the fundamental quality of care and outcomes are based in general practice, though supported by more specialist colleagues.

Asthma associated topics

Short acting beta agonist problems and solutions I need more of my Ventolin inhalers - and you should be providing me with two inhalers each prescription!

Exacerbation management in Asthma I need some more steroids for my asthma flare ups - the out of hours said I should keep some in.

COPD associated topics

Is it really COPD - some common catches? The hospital tell me that the tests show I have COPD and emphysema - but to come to you for further assessment. (The emergency diagnosis and the CT finding of emphysema) - What are you going to do?

Asthma and COPD - does it overlap? I used to have asthma but now they tell me it is COPD - did the clinicians who told me it was asthma get it wrong before?

What are the non-drug pharmacological options for COPD? You've given me the inhalers but what else can I do?

Pharmacological interventions made easy Is GOLD fake and should we be NICEr? Improving symptoms and reducing exacerbations made easier for primary (and secondary) care

Exacerbation management in COPD It's my third exacerbation this year doc - and last time I had to call out of hours as someone stopped my repeat of steroids and antibiotics - what is going on?
